Figure 1 - 1: Regional Growth Relative to California and the United States






Figure 1 - 2: Industry Shares and Growth




Figure 2 - 3: Accom. & Food Srvcs






Figure 2 - 5: Educ. Services





Figure 2 - 7: Admin, Support, & Waste
